Christian Brown is a professional dancerchoreographer based in Scranton, Pennsylvania. A North Pocono High School Graduate, he trained at Turi Studio of Dance (Scranton, PA) for 8 years before attending the American Musical and Dramatic Academy (Manhattan, NYC), majoring in dance theatre. Upon graduating, Christian went on to perform and choreograph on and off-Broadway in New York City; internationally in Niagara Falls, Canada and Tokyo, Japan; regionally in Hilton Head, South Carolina and Lancaster, Pennsylvania; and much more.

Since The Brown Initiative's conception in 2017, Christian's role as co-owner has led to collaborations with many organizations. TBI

has worked with Diamond Academy of Dance, North Pocono High School's Music and Drama departments, the Diocese of Scranton, Scranton School District, St. Luke's Health Network, and many more, to help enrich and strengthen various youth organizations throughout Lackawanna County and beyond, through fundraising and educational means.

The Brown Initiative's dance sector, aptly christened "TBI DANCE," serves as a way of bringing together dancers from all different studios, companies, and backgrounds. DANCErs in our Performance Company have the opportunity to train and perform at the intensity of a professional dancer in New York City or Los Angeles. TBI DANCErs perform fresh, exciting choreography as part of The Brown Initiative's annual live music and dance concerts, as well as in various festivals and other local events around northeastern Pennsylvania.

TBI DANCE gives local dancers a taste of what it's like to be a professional in today's fast-paced, diverse dance industry, right here at home.

II. PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- a. As part of TBI DANCE Performance Company, TBI DANCErs will perform multiple times throughout the year. These performances range from live stage productions to festival appearances to visual media and more.
- b. TBI DANCErs will learn and perform in a multitude of dance styles, including (but not limited to) tap, jazz, contemporary, hip-hop, flamenco, and ballet.
- c. TBI DANCE consists of three groups of dancers:
 - 1. Middle School (grades 6-8)
 - 2. High School (grades 9-12)
 - 3. Adults (staff members, adult students)
- d. TBI DANCE is not a conventional dance studio. We are a performance company that collaborates with multiple dance studios. Student and staff dancers from each collaborating studio attend rehearsals to learn choreography for upcoming performances, which showcase local talent from varying backgrounds while enriching youth organizations through fundraisers, educational opportunities, etc.
- e. Rather than committing to an entire year, TBI DANCErs commit on a show-by-show basis (please see section **III. Program Structure**).
- f. All regular Sunday rehearsals will take place at The Brown Initiative: 1355 N Main Ave, Scranton, PA 18508. Dress rehearsals and performances will take place at each applicable show venue.
- g. Private dance and vocal training are offered, but they are by no means required. Please contact Christian privately if interested.

- b. Should a conflict arise, please contact Christian via email or phone as soon as possible.
- c. Make-up rehearsals, performances, etc. will be scheduled in the event of inclement weather, etc.

V. DISCLAIMERS

- a. Regarding program structure, this contract is applicable to section III. PROGRAM STRUCTURE, 1. Fall 2024: 8th Annual Kick-off to Christmas Production only. Registrants are committing to the fall season between September 8 – December 19, 2024.
- b. There is no monthly tuition to join TBI DANCE. However, there is a \$100 registration fee due at time of registering. Payments may be made via cash, check (made out to "The Brown Initiative"), or Venmo (@thebrowninitiativellc).
- c. Dancers are **not** responsible for purchasing costumes. Instead, a nominal costume rental fee is built into the registration fee.
- d. Dancers are responsible for providing their own dance shoes, undergarments, and rehearsal attire. Clothing should be form-fitting and easy to fully stretch and move in.
- e. All dancers will need the following types of footwear/dance shoes: black flat tap shoes (full sole w/shoelaces), flesh-tone slip-on jazz shoes, and socks. Dancers will be notified if additional footwear/shoes are required.

- f. The owners/staff of The Brown Initiative are not responsible for any lost or stolen property.
- g. Students/performers and their affiliates agree not to hold The Brown Initiative or its owners/staff responsible for any injuries inflicted during classes, rehearsals, or performances.
- h. Students/performers and their affiliates recognize that they are participating in an advanced, intensive program that may be physically, emotionally, and psychologically challenging.
- Students/performers and their affiliates may be filmed, photographed, or recorded during classes, rehearsals, performances, or other events. Said media may be used in visual/audio media, on social media platforms, in printed publications and advertisements, etc.
- j. Registrants and their affiliates acknowledge that their submission of the online registration form for TBI DANCE acts as a virtual signature, committing them to the Fall 2024 season, as detailed in section III.
