Christian Brown is a professional dancer-choreographer based in Scranton,
Pennsylvania. A North Pocono High School
Graduate, he trained at Turi Studio of Dance
(Scranton, PA) for 8 years before attending
the American Musical and Dramatic Academy
(Manhattan, NYC), majoring in dance theatre.
Upon graduating, Christian went on to
perform and choreograph on and offBroadway in New York City; internationally in
Niagara Falls, Canada and Tokyo, Japan;
regionally in Hilton Head, South Carolina and
Lancaster, Pennsylvania; and much more.

Since The Brown Initiative's conception in 2017, Christian's role as co-owner has led to collaborations with many organizations. TBI

has worked with Diamond Academy of Dance, North Pocono High School's Music and Drama departments, the Diocese of Scranton, Scranton School District, St. Luke's Health Network, and many more, to help enrich and strengthen various youth organizations throughout Lackawanna County and beyond, through fundraising and educational means.

The Brown Initiative's dance sector, aptly christened "TBI DANCE," serves as a way of bringing together dancers from all different studios, companies, and backgrounds. DANCErs in our Performance Company have the opportunity to train and perform at the intensity of a professional dancer in New York City or Los Angeles. TBI DANCErs perform fresh, exciting choreography as part of The Brown Initiative's annual live music and dance concerts, as well as in various festivals and other local events around northeastern Pennsylvania.

Christian offers private dance and vocal lessons to dancers and singers of all ages. He approaches each student in a way that best suits them, allowing them to grow exponentially in a variety of styles and techniques.

II. PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- a. Dancers and Singers taking private lessons may have the option to perform in various performances throughout the year. These performances range from live stage productions to festival appearances to visual media and more. <u>Please note that participating in performances is not required.</u>
- b. Private dance lessons are offered in a multitude of dance styles, including (but not limited to) tap, jazz, hip-hop, and ballet. Private lessons may focus on technique, choreography, or both.
- c. Private vocal lessons are structured to help each student find their true, natural singing voice, and to strengthen and expand their voice. Private lessons may focus on technique, vocal performance, or both.
- d. All private lessons will take place at The Brown Initiative: 1355 N Main Ave, Scranton, PA 18508. Dress rehearsals and performances will take place at each applicable show venue.

IV. ATTENDANCE

- a. It is imperative that students attend all rehearsals, performances, and other events within their designated level/group.
- b. Should a conflict arise, please contact Christian via email or phone as soon as possible.
- c. Make-up rehearsals, performances, etc. will be scheduled in the event of inclement weather, etc.

V. DISCLAIMERS

- a. Tuition for private dance and vocal training is \$25/half-hour or \$50/hour. Additionally, there is a \$25 registration fee due at time of registering.
- b. Tuition **must be paid in full** at the beginning of each month. Payments may be made via cash, check (made out to "The Brown Initiative"), or Venmo (@thebrowninitiativello).
- c. Tuition will **not** be prorated for missed private lessons. If The Brown Initiative must cancel a private lesson, a make-up date will be offered, or the cost of the missed lesson will be credited to your account.
- d. Students who are performing in the fall 2024 and/or spring 2025 productions are **not** responsible for purchasing costumes. Instead, a nominal costume rental fee will be charged, once for fall 2024 and once for spring 2025.
- e. Students are responsible for providing their own dance shoes/footwear, undergarments, and rehearsal attire. Clothing should be form-fitting and easy to fully stretch and move in.
- f. Dancers who are performing in the fall 2024 and/or spring 2025 productions will need the following types of footwear/dance shoes: black flat tap shoes (full sole w/shoelaces) and flesh-tone slip-on jazz

shoes. Dancers will be notified if additional footwear/shoes are required.

- g. The owners/staff of The Brown Initiative are not responsible for any lost or stolen property.
- h. Students/performers and their affiliates agree not to hold The Brown Initiative or its owners/staff responsible for any injuries inflicted during classes, rehearsals, or performances.
- Students/performers and their affiliates recognize that they are participating in an advanced, intensive program that may be physically, emotionally, and psychologically challenging.
- j. Students/performers and their affiliates may be filmed, photographed, or recorded during classes, rehearsals, performances, or other events. Said media may be used in visual/audio media, on social media platforms, in printed publications and advertisements, etc.
- k. Registrants and their affiliates acknowledge that their submission of the online registration form for TBI DANCE acts as a virtual signature, committing them to the Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 seasons, as detailed in section **III. PROGRAM STRUCTURE**, and all applicable statutes detailed in this document.
